# My dear family in Christ,

I have written for The Inland See as the Vicar General of the Diocese, as the Administrator of the Diocese and as the Bishop-elect of the Diocese, but this is my first column written as the Bishop of Burlington. This past Monday, July 15th, was a day of great joy and grace for me and, I pray, for the entire Diocese of Burlington. The Mass of Ordination and Installation was an incredible celebration of faith and a promise of wonderful things to come for the Catholics in Vermont. I wish to express my deep appreciation for all of those who in any way were part of the preparation and coordination for the liturgies, receptions, and every aspect of the Ordination. This is not just the responsibility of the 11th Bishop of Burlington, but the responsibility of everyone who has been baptized, confirmed, and nourished

by the Eucharist. We remind ourselves that "God alone suffices" and is the answer to the deepest longings of everyone's heart, and we will strive to help people fulfill that longing by bringing them Christ, His Church and His love.

Let us pray for one another as we follow the voice of the True Shepherd, Jesus Christ.
