3rd Liturgical Music Festival to be held on September 15 at Holy Family in Essex Junction

The a capella Liturgical Music Festival is an initiative dedicated to Liturgical Music in Vermont. Organized by Sharon Trani and Fr. Matthew Rensch, with about 20-30 musicians from around the Diocese participating at each event, the recurring event shares various choral music and provides music for an evening Mass, highlights include music by Mozart, Palestrina, and John Stainer.

Beautiful sacred music is integral to the Church's liturgical worship, drawing our hearts to God and calling the faithful to holiness. It helps "to draw out the beauty of the Christian mysteries" (Catholic Hymnody at the Service of the Church, USCCB). "Music has long played an important role in the life of the Church...the Church's musical tradition is a treasure of inestimable value" (Sacrosanctum Concilium), No. 112.

Father George William Rutler in his book "The Stories of Hymns" states that "the Mass itself is its own gigantic hymn". He laments that our Church music today is often lacking in beauty or deep meaning. Father Rutler calls for a return to beautiful, well done, and well-chosen liturgical music that elevates our hearts and minds to Almighty God.

The music festivals aim to accomplish precisely that, not only at the events themselves, but with reverberating effects and more and more people encountering and contributing to the gloriously rich musical tradition of the Church.

The 3rd Liturgical Music Festival will be held Sunday,

September 15th at 4:30 pm, at Holy Family Church in Essex Junction. The hour between 4:30 and 5:30 pm consists of small choirs sharing their favorite pieces. Dinner is at 5:30 pm. Everyone, choir members as well as individual singers, practice together at 6 pm for the 7:30 pm Mass. Matthew Santos, who studied voice at the Oberlin Conservatory, directed a parish choir for a several years and is now a student at Thomas Aquinas College in Northfield, Massachusetts, will direct the full choir.

Everyone who loves to sing is welcome, along with appreciative listeners. The Mass music typically includes four or five hymns sung in parts, and a more advanced piece as well. Past examples have been John Stainer's "God so Loved the World" and Mozart's "Ave Verum." The group is working on parts of Palestrina's "Missa Brevis" at the September event. Musicians are expected to practice ahead of time. If you're interested in participating, music and practice videos are provided on the website below.
