Down in Adoration Falling: The Practice of Eucharistic Adoration

arlier this year, the Vatican and the Bishops of the United States approved a revised translation of the ritual book Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharistic Mystery Outside of Mass, first published in English in 1976. It's an obscure little book; my guess is that most parishes don't have a copy of it on their bookshelves. Nonetheless, it contains the official texts and rubrics for some important Catholic rituals that are often celebrated in our parishes, one of which is the Rite of

Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction. The approval of this revised text, which is mandated for use the First Sunday of Advent, gives us an opportune time to review some basics about Exposition and Benediction, and its related devotion: Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

First, some clarification on terminology. Oftentimes, when Catholics talk about Adoration, such as "I'm going to Adoration," what they have in mind is Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament exposed for view in a monstrance. But Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, strictly speaking, is an act of personal devotion

and prayer before the Blessed Sacrament – whether that act is done at Mass (such as Adoring the Real Presence of Christ when the priest elevates the host or chalice at the consecration or before Communion when he says, "Behold the Lamb of God"), private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle, or private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament that is exposed for solemn adoration in a monstrance. In fact, the Church proposes that the normative way one adores the Blessed Sacrament is not before the Eucharist exposed in the monstrance, but before the reserved Sacrament in the tabernacle. One of the original intentions of reserving the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle is for the private adoration of the

faithful, and the Church encourages us to make frequent trips of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle.

Thus, even if your parish doesn't have regular times of Exposition, know that the practice of Adoration is available to you whenever the church building is open. Even if the church is not open, being mindful of the Blessed Sacrament present in the tabernacle as you pass by the church can be in itself an act of adoration and a practice that can lead one to greater devo-

tion. And don't forget your own private adoration when you are at Mass (before, during, and after Mass). As the consecrated host and wine are elevated during the consecration, I always make it a point to visually adore the sacred species while quietly praying (in the words of St. Thomas the Apostle), "My Lord and my God, my God and my all."

Adoration is a private, devotional act, and the Church leaves it to each individual as to how to adore the Sacrament. Of course, we don't want to be distracting to others who might also be in prayer, but one can sing, pray aloud, kneel and even

prostrate before the Blessed Sacrament. Most times, one simply remains in the presence of God in silence, alternating between prayer, contemplative. One can offer the Liturgy of the Hours, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet or offer novenas. The treasury of the Church is rich when it comes to prayer before the Blessed Sacrament
