My dear family in Christ,

"Why do you seek the living one among the dead?" (Lk 24:5). This question posed by the angels to the women who had come to mourn at the tomb of Jesus has always struck me as something I need to ask myself on regular basis. It seems that there are times in my life of faith when I forget that the Lord is risen. I think of him as a historical figure from the past who is but a distant memory. Saint Luke offers us another reminder of this in the story on the disciples on the road to Emmaus, "How foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke!" (Lk 24:25).
