Closing Mass Homily**

I had the opportunity to travel to Rome for the Synod Jubilee October 24 to 26, 2025. This was unexpected given our current diocesan circumstances, but Bishop McDermott asked if I would be open to going “if he could secure funding.” This ended up being provided through the generosity of the Vermont Knights of Columbus.

I went with high hopes, eager anticipation, and some trepidation as I was traveling solo and the lone representative of my diocese. Those hopes and anticipation were realized as I experienced the universality of the Catholic Church and the vibrancy of a Church seeking to respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit, guided by our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, building on the vision laid out by Pope Francis.

It was incredibly moving to be with Pope Leo for an hour and 40 minutes on Friday evening. It was duly noted how he had participated in every stage of the synodal process: as a Bishop in Peru for the initial stage, as head of the Dicastery of Bishops for the second stage during the October sessions in 2023 and 2024, and now as our Holy Father for this implementation stage. It was edifying to watch him taking notes as the seven continental regions gave their reports, and then answering each question extemporaneously with a mixture of warmth, wisdom, and even some humor. I was particularly moved to hear the affection with which he addressed the Latin American Church, the tenderness with which he spoke to the Middle Eastern Church, and the

warmth he showed to both the African and Asian Churches. His presence and actions among us that evening were an experience and model of synodality.

I enjoyed the companionship of fellow synod pilgrims from around the world. I think of my new friends from Lithuania as we searched for the special gate to enter for the Pilgrimage to the Holy Door. Together, we ended up going through four security checks as we navigated one wrong entrance after another! I think of the friendly delegation from Alaska, the priest from Thailand, the auxiliary bishop that I was partnered with in one of the sessions, the delegation from England, and I could go on. It was a gift to join these fellow pilgrims from around the world in prayer, workshops, and conversations.

For me it still feels surreal. A few weeks ago, I was sitting with some 2,000 brothers and sisters in Christ, learning from each other, praying together, and together seeking to discern where the Holy Spirit is leading us on mission in a true spirit of synodality.

As a deacon, it was a once in a lifetime experience to assist at Mass with Pope Leo and have the privilege of distributing Communion to the faithful from around the world in St. Peter's Square.

On the return flight home (Rome to Zurich to Montreal), I ended up sitting next to a “fellow traveler” who had been in Rome for a different conference. She had noticed me praying and mentioned how nice that was to see. She shared that she was Orthodox and we would go on to spend much of the long flight sharing stories of family life, children, and work in a spirit-inspired atmosphere of listening and encouragement. In a certain sense it was a very “synodal” conversation. It was perhaps a very fitting way to end a pilgrimage on synodality, being in communion with one another through our common Baptism in Christ, truly listening to one another, and ultimately encouraging each other in our Christian mission in this life.
